2019



opportunities to know and get in touch with the Chinese families in the South Auckland area, these opportunities allow us to invite them to our services and camps, and share the gospel.

- The office reroof/reno needs to be undertaken urgently, as we continue to rely on some interim stop gap measures to prevent flooding every time it rains. See build options discussion document later in the Annual Report as to the options available.
- Finally, the continuing conversation around what might happen with the back buildings (known as The Den and Chapel), and the resealing of the car park. This continues to sit on the back burner, and will remain so, until a clear Spirit breathed vision is revealed, as any work on this part of the MBC property will require significant capital investment and we don't want to inhibit our ability to respond to what God already has before us.

MBC Intentional Communities Frank Walton

An Intentional Community is a smallish group of Jesus-followers who believe God has called them to a defined neighbourhood. They aim to show and share the good news of Jesus' redemptive kingdom through establishing regular, ongoing relationships with neighbours. Members of the core-group share a commitment to a set of neighbouring values and practices and help keep one another accountable through regular group prayer times and group meetings.

2019

As a follow on from 23 of us from MBC going down to South West Baptist Church in Christchurch last October, two communities have started up. One in Manurewa South around South School, and the other in Randwick Park.

This strategy of showing and sharing the Good News by a strong commitment to 'place' is growing among Baptist churches throughout NZ, as well as other denominations. Recently, a Baptist Intentional Communities Retreat called 'Te Ara' (the path/trail/way) was held at Parakai led by Ruby Duncan and Dave Tims. 25 folk from different parts of NZ gathered for discussion and encouragement.

Manurewa South Community

Well, it's been a full-on 12 months! Manurewa South formed at the start of this year. A bunch of us were inspired and equipped after spending some time with South West Baptist in October last year. So we came home, and after a six-week

process of discernment, shared our personal stories and looked for glimpses of God at work in us. (Carter, Casey and van den Berg whānau.)

We each defined a personal mission, and looking for the common threads, defined four values that we could all orient our lives around.

Our Community // We seek to love this place, its streets and its people. We are present and make willing connections in Manurewa South. One of the ways this looks is walking to places, and not rushing there!

Seeking Shalom // We seek "completeness" or "Shalom" in ourselves and others, particularly those in need, who live in our community. This looks like regular prayer together, deep conversations with neighbours, connecting people to services, doing the gritty work in ourselves and being accountable.

Learning Together // Learning in relationship with our neighbours to discover kingdom wisdom. We give up self-sufficiency to discover Christ together.

Walking Towards // We seek to respond to God's call to love those on the margins and actively make space in our lives to connect with others.

So basically, it means we do life here, seeking to help build the Kingdom of God in the place we are in with the people around us. One example is the weekly meal we share with a neighbour on our street. We've known him for years, but having that regular space each week has greatly deepened our relationship. He now often tells us he prays for us and loves to talk about issues in







the country and our take on them. We're really just getting started, and are looking forward to the Casey whānau moving house in the next few months and discovering what Christ is doing in this place, together.

Randwick Park

What a privilege it's been to move into Randwick Park and join Dave and Denise Tims in intentional, community living!

Over the last six months we've been taking a lot of time together to work out our shared values and vision, and then creating practices that we agree to that help us live that out! One of the values is to be present in our neighbourhood, so a practice that comes from that is that we've all agreed to buy our milk from the local dairy. Usually we walk there, we chat to the person working and then we walk home. It's such a simple act but it really gives us time to engage

and observe what's going on around us.

We also value spending time with Jesus in prayer and so we've committed to having prayer together in our garage five mornings a week for half an hour. It's been an adjustment getting up earlier, but man it's been cool! If you'd ever like to join us you're more than welcome, Monday-Friday 7.15-7.45!!

There are a lot of things within our shared values that I would like to say Francois and I could do wherever we were but, the actual truth is that as humans we are so easily distracted and actually living out our values takes a lot of effort and planning. By doing this in community we can encourage each other! Those practices are already set up to become just part of our new normal rather than something we are consciously trying to remember to fit in! And it's also way more fun doing it with other people!

Baptist Missionary Fellowship Bob Payne

2019

Win: we have an amazing bunch of leaders that have run our 3-4's programme over this past year. Unlike UpStreet, we rotate about 5 key leaders, each doing a half term block. Despite the challenges of time, they have all brought real love, commitment and creativity to the ministry, creating an awesome experience that our kids and parents have been grateful for.

Win: In Sync. One of the exciting things we have been working towards, and is now finally in place, is syncing our under 5 spaces so the kids hear the same Bible story and message through the week. Under 5's thrive on repetition, so hearing the same thing in more than one ministry space allows the message to really sink in. Kiddy Winks Kindy and First Look on a Sunday are now teaching the same bible stories with the same bottom line. We hope this will also make it easier for families exploring faith to engage with the content.

2020

Parenting under 5's is always a challenge phase in parenting. Please pray for us as we continue to explore ways we can inspire and equip our parents to nature their children's faith throughout this time. We have some awesome tools at our disposal, the challenge is helping parents find the tools that work just right for them and their rhythms of life.

MBC Strategic planning Sept 2019

In September 2019, the eldership team and pastoral staff spent two days at a strategic planning weekend. We spent time reflecting on the past couple of years, giving thanks to God for his faithfulness, praying for one another and reflecting on our practices and ministries. In this setting, we sought to hear God's voice through your stories and hopes that we carry, as told by you and as observed as your pastors and elders. We then spent time looking forward, exploring how we as a church have a specific role to play in Gods redemption story. From this, we came away with a clear framework that has given guidance to how we might intentionally position ourselves to be more effectively aligned with the Spirit of God as MBC.

- Three overarching values that we sense are to become significant drivers for us are Intentional, Presence, drenched in Love.
- Given these values, we then reflected on how we might resource you, as God's people, to practice with these values at your core.
- We came up with the following roles that we see as keys to delivering the outcomes.

Eldership

Our eldership is there to provide governance and to hold us to the mission to which God has called us. Namely: All roles within the Church family serve one task, to serve the Mission of God so people find and follow Him. We do this by partnering with the Spirit of God and each other.

Key Pastoral Roles

Our Pastors are there to disciple and resource our church family into intentional presencebased mission. Specifically, we have identified the following pastoral roles as priorities for MBC.

READ ME: Some of these pastoral roles can be met by the same pastor and/or multiple roles can be held by more than one individual. Equally, some roles can be delivered through lay pastors.

- Lead Pastor: To Pastor the church into a right relationship with our God through alignment between governance and management. This is done by developing strategies through partnership that releases the wider staff to focus on supporting those in their respective area of responsibility.
- **Teaching pastor:** Providing leadership in delivering a biblically-based program that equips, inspires and holds people to God's redeeming mission in the lives of our people. That faithfully brings us to share the gospel through word, sign, and deed
- Connections pastor: Helping people find and follow Jesus through connection with one another- key areas of responsibility: home groups, welcome teams, community ministries and helping us excel at hospitality.
- Sunday curator: Responsible for shaping the Sunday services to capture our four key practices of – Worship, Connection, Word, Response.

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- **Neighbouring pastor:** Helping our people be present locally
- Children's and young families Pastor:
 Working with 0 -12-year-olds and their families to live faith at school and at home.
 This is through encouraging and equipping them with tools that help them on the journey, and by providing environments where there can grow in their faith together and invite their friends to be part of the adventure.
- Youth Pastor: To love the youth of MBC and Manurewa community, through coordinating programmes for the youth throughout the week. The goal of these events is for the youth to have a space to engage, learn, find belonging and purpose, and encouraged in the journey of finding and following Christ. A youth pastor also represents the voice of the youth to the wider church.
- Young adults Pastor: Walking with 18 to 30-year-olds to deepen their faith in Jesus through real and brave conversations and experiences that intersect with their everyday lives.
- Pastor to the baby boomers: As this is such a critical transitional stage, we want to help this demographic live meaningful, counter-cultural, God-centred lives.
- Pastor to the seniors: Helping our seniors in their later years have meaningful lives and finish the race well.
- Pastoral care/counselling pastor:
 To provide meaningful pastoral care services using biblical principles in partnership with professionals and lay workers.

Support staff:

Specialist support roles:

- Office Staff: Reception / admin
- Communications: Team comms, digital and social media ministry coordinator/ Events coordinator
- Administrator / finance / I.T. / Strategic property development/maintenance, environment design
- Other ministries / values we seek to inform our practice: intergenerational
- Bi-cultural / Cross-cultural / missional (both locally and internationally) / environmental sustainability (kaitiaki) / Justice / hospitality / generosity / partnership (better together).

Priority values for 2020 at MBC

Because all roles within the Church family serve one task, namely to serve the Mission of God so people find and follow Him. And we seek to do this by partnering with the Spirit of God and each other. Within this, as a leadership team, we sense that the following values are to inform key practices that the Spirit is calling us to focus in on and know deeply.

'Presence'

From 'Present'. Adjective. In a particular place.

The phrase 'presence based ministry' seeks to highlight the practice given to us in the person of Jesus. He came and dwelt among us, bringing not just a code to live by, but rather a presence to live with and through. The implications of this are staggering and far-reaching. It requires self-sacrifice and commitment, it requires intimacy with each other and His Holy Spirit, to hear His voice. We want to help you be relationally present wherever God has intentionally placed you, be it at home, in your neighbourhood, at Church, at your place of work or study. And to do so, inspired and empowered by His Holy Presence.

'Intentionality'

From: 'Intentional'. Adjective. Done on purpose; deliberate.

Again we see this modelled by Christ. At just the right time, He came into the world. At just the right time, you have been placed with great intentionality by God for his purposes and glory. As a church, we want to be deliberately strategic in our efforts in helping you identify this for your life so that we each can make the most of the opportunities in the seasons of our lives that God presents.

As we seek to be present and intentional, let us do so dripping in Love, respecting every person as being made in the image of God, and created to know and love Him.

Intentionally present on Sundays

With all this talk of intentionality and presence some might ask 'so what about Sunday?' Rest assured, this is not offered as an 'either/or', but rather as a 'both/and'. Sunday gathering will remain a key practice and value of MBC.

The relationship between the missional edge and the Sunday gathering keeps the whole body healthy. Sunday helps anchor the mission to its key mandate, Christ. Equally, the missional edge brings life to the Sunday gathering. While we must always ask 'is Sunday relevant', the answer (if in doubt) shouldn't be to cease gathering together, but rather to ask if our gathering honours God and is obedient to His word.

We need the Sunday gathering to keep Christ at the center of all we do, avoiding 'missional drift' where the mission becomes more important than the master. It is also a great mission statement, where we each bring our God-given diversity and passion and commit to be intentional and present with God and one another.

We constantly seek to align with what we believe the Spirit is doing amongst us. Consequently, we want to ensure that the following practices happen each time we gather. Typically, they are happening in the following sequence...(though we're always looking for ways to 'mix it up'.)

- 1. Worship towards God: we want the whole service to be 'worshipful'. To help in this, we recognise that there are gifts that God has given us that help orientate us towards Him more readily. That is why we give time for singing, praying, and other practices that remind us of who God is, and for us to experience His presence together.
- 2. Connection with each other: Jesus

said that the world will know we are HIS by the love we have for one another. Sundays can be a glimpse of the future where God unites all who love him, where diversity is embraced. We see this when we regularly set aside time to hear from each other and pray for each other, worship God together, and share communion, as we recognise the presence of Christ amongst us.

- **3. Word:** Our Baptist tradition reminds us that we can best know God's ways by gathering together and allowing his word to read us. That is why we commit to hearing the word of God opened and expanded on for our context and our time. (At this point we break into children and adult ministries so that the material is age accessible).
- 4. Response: This is our 'so what' space.


 We've worshipped God together, listened to his word... so what? What does this mean for me/you? How might I re-orientate my thinking and practice in light of what I've just experienced? This is why our services might end with us once again singing praise to our God for His grace, it might mean we fall to our knees and confess, maybe it means getting into groups and praying for each other or catching up with someone later in the week... whatever it is, we want to help make sure we leave committed to the ongoing change and transformation that Christ has committed to complete in us.

So, Church, "don't neglect the gathering as some have been accustomed to doing" (Heb 10)... equally let us not hide away within our Church walls, "let us be salt and light" in all areas of our lives (Matt 5), for all need to be present in the gathering and the world.

Average Sunday Attendance



Did you know?

In 2019, once again our 'free' Family Camp 'paid for itself. 180 people attended, with an amazing baptism service held at Camp making up part of our four baptisms this year.

Nicole joined us just over 6 months ago as an Associate Pastor responsible for Youth. She has built real relationships, wider than that of just the youth, through consuming 325 coffees and 217 cupcakes, while her husband Francios has fixed his way into our hearts by repairing innumerable fixtures that need mending.

Vince has spent the last year working with our young adults in the capacity of a Carey student pastor, helping our people ask the hard questions.

Lyndon has been here now as Senior Pastor for over three years and is ready to get funky (watch this space). **Dave** has served at MBC as Children's and families pastor for 13 years (and it shows), and **Lois** has been the pastor to the seniors for 15 years, outliving just about everyone.

Carol continues to work three half days in the office, greeting all who come through our doors. **Chris** G, having served forever in the office, is going down to one day a week so she can help care for three additional impending grandchildren due at the end of the year.

We have seen love expressed amongst us at the passing of some who have lived for ninety years, and others who passed as they had just begun to grow. We have seen some recover well from difficult health issues, and others who continue the struggle to begin another day.

Do you know that when we run through the Church Directory, we can count over 100 people actively serving in multiple spaces and roles within the life of our church's weekly rhythm?

Frank Walton has entered the 'gold card zone', and has marked it by donating most of his week to serving the community in some way or form (including the formation of a community garden out the front of the church). Five families have either sold their home or bought a home so that they or others can be more intentional in the communities they live in.

Come 2020, we have opportunities ahead of us to be more intentional and present every day, ways in which we can live and reflect the love of Christ. What an exciting call we have all been given. For some it means a first-ever missions trip overseas, for others, it means baking a cake for the neighbour. For some, it means brave conversations at work, for others, similar chats at school.
